SUMMARY

The National Fish & Wildlife Foundation offers grants through its Innovative Nutrient and Sediment Reduction Grants program (INSR) to support collaborative, regionalscale partnerships that accelerate water quality improvements.

- Funded under the Chesapeake Bay Stewardship Fund
- Administered by National Fish & Wildlife Foundation
- Annual program funding (2023): \$30 million
- Funding Source: Federal Budget EPA Chesapeake Bay Program Office, USDA NRCS, US Forest Service and US Fish & Wildlife Service; Private - Altria Group

FEATURES

Program grants range from \$500,000 - \$1 million. Grants must be completed within three years of grant award.

2023 program has new focus on nature-based infrastructure grants, supporting existing partnerships, and enhancing diversity, equity, inclusion and justice outcomes.

Program uses FieldDoc to demonstrate reductions in pollution.

ELIGIBILITY

Who is Eligible?

Existing partnerships which can demonstrate effective mechanisms for achieving water quality improvements; Non-profit organizations, local governments, state agencies, and educational institutions.

Eliqible Costs

Projects must be within Chesapeake Bay Watershed and support local Watershed Implementation Plans (WIPs).

Match: 1:1 match required

Key areas: partnerships and network growth, managing ag land runoff, green infrastructure, forested buffers, floodplain and wetland reconnection, and conservation finance and market development.

HELPFUL TIPS

Contact the CWQE for organizations and agencies that have received regional grants for work in 2021/2022 focusing on such BMPs as streamside buffers, rotational grazing, and soil health.

Examples include regional authorities for stormwater program funding, agricultural coalitions, and multi-sector partnerships.

HOW TO APPLY

Applicants to consult with NFWF by November 3, 2022 prior to being directed to submit a full proposal. Full proposals due November 17, 2022. Awards announced in March 2022.
